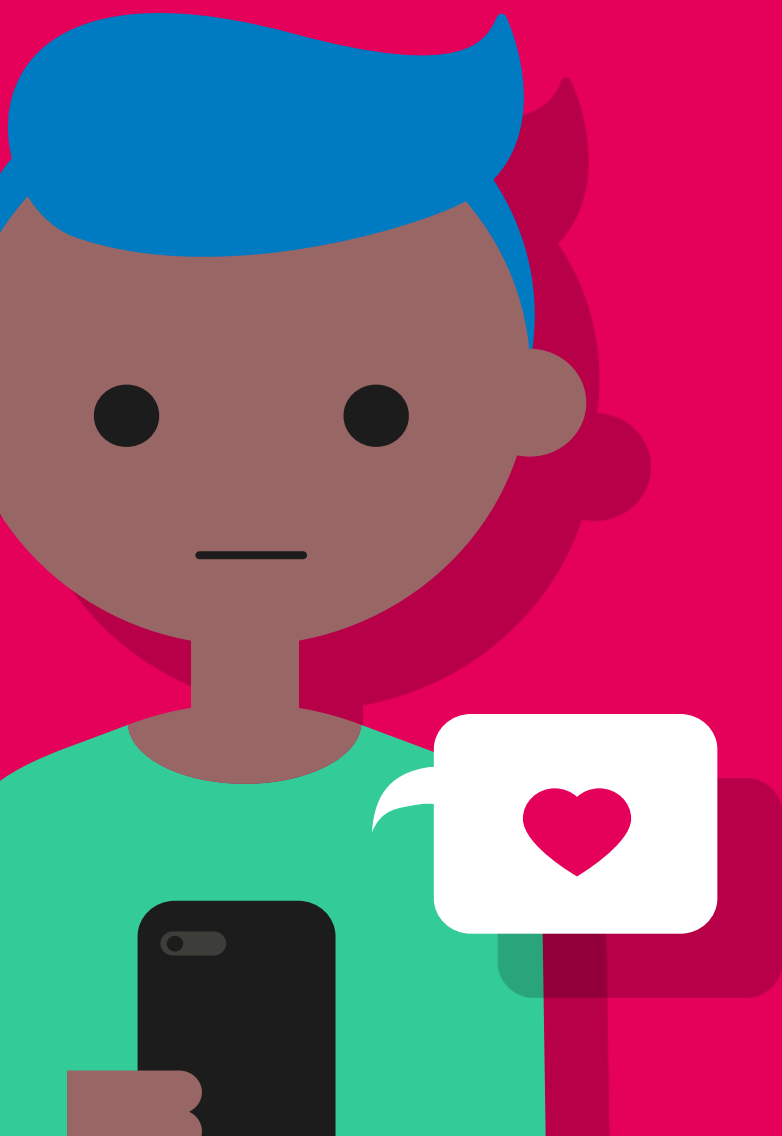


The average child posts around *26 times a day* on social media but *only 6 out of 10* followers are real friends.
