

GOING PLACES SAFELY

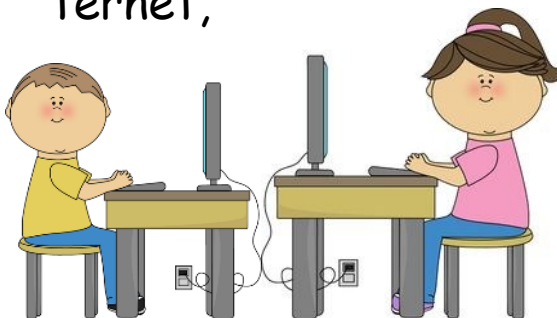
- Before children access any websites it is important to spend time setting rules for how to stay safe online.

SENDING EMAIL

- Before children begin to send their own messages we teach them what emails they should/shouldn't open.
- Using animations and e-books we explore how emails should be used to talk only to people we know in 'real life'.
- We explore similarities and differences between an email and a postcard/letter.

- We learn that one way for sites to order their listings is alphabetically.
