



Summer Term in Year 1



Welcome back!

We really hope that you all had a lovely Easter with your families and as always we have enjoyed hearing about all the stories and little adventures the children have had. We are very proud of how well the children have settled back into school routines after the Easter break so far.

The school's website will continue to regularly be updated with pictures of the children enjoying their school day.

This term, the children will be exploring 'Big Questions' in every non-core subject to enable them to apply their learning in different concepts. Our big questions are:

Geography – *What is the United Kingdom?*

Computing – *How can computers help us to draw?*

PE – *How can you improve your co-ordination?
How is challenging yourself going to improve you?*

Science – *Are all plants and trees the same?*

Art – *How do paintings express mood?*

PSHE – *Does everyone have a strength?*

RE – *What do places of worship show about people's belief in their God?*

Music – *How does our singing make people feel?*

Our class assembly linked to science will be this term.

Reading Books – These need to be in school daily. The children will receive a book matched to their phonetic ability which will be changed weekly depending on which phonics group they are in. This is expected to be in school throughout the week. The children will also receive a Reading for Pleasure book to share with adults at home on a Friday. If you would like

any support or tips regarding reading and/or phonics to use at home to support your child, please let us know - we will happily help in any way we can! **Please ensure reading books are returned to school.**

Phonics - In Term 6, Year 1 pupils undertake a National Phonics Screen Check, whereby they are required to read 40 real and nonsense words using their phonics ability to decode the words. We strongly recommend reading daily with your child to encourage them to apply their phonics knowledge. We will be sending the children with weekly sounds to practise and words to read so please use this effectively at home too. If you require any other support or information about this please do not hesitate to ask.

Homework - Homework is important and we will expect it to be completed and handed in on time. It helps consolidate learning and build up your child's confidence. These will be given out inside homework books on a **Friday** and to be completed and handed in on the following **Wednesday**. Spellings will continue to be set on a Friday and tested on the following Thursday/Friday.

PE- A quick reminder that earrings need to be removed or covered on P.E days (in line with the school's policy). PE days are Monday and Wednesday.



Uniform - Please can we remind you to make yourselves aware of the school's uniform policy - this includes appropriate haircuts, styles and accessories. 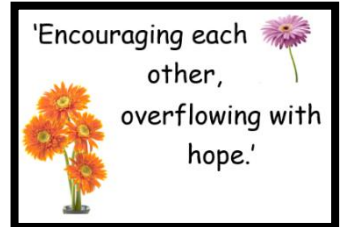

Year 1 Team

Art- How do paintings express mood? To know that a painting is an **expression** of ideas and emotions. We explore the artworks: Water-lily pond by Claude Monet, Bouquet by Henri Matisse, Petunia No.2 by Georgia O'Keeffe and explore the ideas and emotions in the painting

English Skills
This term we will be using the texts 'The magic porridge pot', 'Lost and Found' and 'The enormous turnip'. Our focus will be on retelling the story and consolidating the use of punctuation in our sentences. We will also be writing a recount of our trip to the farm where the children will learn how to write in past tense.

Science- Are all plants and trees the same?
Working as a biologist to explore plants in the world around them, they will develop the skills of a botanist as they explore and name plants. We will explore the school grounds to identify and name plants, trees and flowers found there. Through firsthand experience the children will be planting different seeds and nurture them to watch them grow.

Year One Summer Term Overview

Computing – How can computers help us draw?

Children will be able to use Microsoft paint effectively to create a picture. They will be able to explain why particular tools have been chosen. Compare paper and computer paintings.

Mathematics
We will begin the term by counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. This will include finding equal groups and making arrays. This then leads into finding halves and quarters. Finally we move on to looking at position and direction.

Geography- What is the United Kingdom?

The children will be learning what countries make up the UK before learning the seas that surround it. They will investigate what a coast is and have a hands on experience when they visit Skegness.

R.E - What do places of worship show about people's belief in their God?

The children will understand that Judaism (followers being Jews) is another, different religion where they have one God – the same God as Christians and Muslims – but they have a different set of instructions on how to live life

PSHE -Does everyone have a strength?

This term the focus is : Living in the Wider World. Children will know what it means to belong to a community and how to care for others and the environment. We will also be looking at safe ways to use the internet and also list how to use it safely. They will be able to name the different jobs which people do and know that different people have different strengths.

P.E. Net and Wall – How can you improve coordination?

Children will develop their skills of attacking and defending e.g. using the ready position to defend their court and placement of the ball in a space. They will also develop their throwing, catching, tracking and hitting a ball skills.

Athletics – How is challenging yourself going to improve you?

The children will develop skills such as running at speed, changing direction, throwing and jumping.
